FY 2024-2025 operations and maintenance funding

Since 1988, state funding has averaged 9% of operation and maintenance costs annually, while state law calls for no less than 40%.

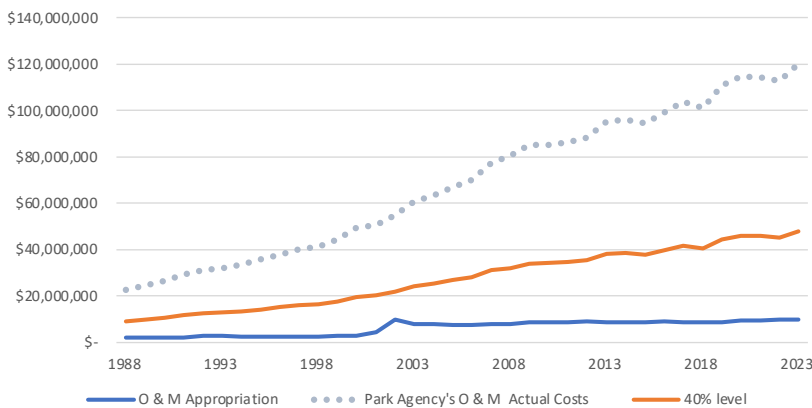
When the state funds operations and maintenance for metropolitan regional parks and trails, it's investing in the people who call this region home – creating high-quality spaces to connect in the outdoors, places that build health, and assets that drive our economy.

With 44 regional parks, 12 park reserves, 55 regional trails, and 8 special recreation features, it takes more than \$120 million each year to keep the whole system in good order.

ADDITIONAL FUNDING NEEDED TO MEET STATUTORY GOAL

Minnesota Statute 473.351 authorizes “no less than” 40% of the actual costs to be appropriated from state funding for the operation and maintenance of our Metropolitan Regional Parks System. With a 9% annual state funding level, this expense falls disproportionately on local taxpayers.
