

### MN DNR Wolf Plan: Vision

- Vision for wolves in Minnesota
  - Minnesota's wolf population will continue to be healthy, widespread across a suitable range, and stable after decades of recovery from historical lows.
- This vision builds on the success of past wolf conservation efforts.



 To support the vision above, the plan describes goals, objectives and strategies for Minnesota's approach to wolf stewardship.

### MN DNR Wolf Plan: Goals

- Maintain a well-connected, resilient wolf population
- Collaborate with diverse partners to collectively support wolf plan implementation
- Minimize and address human-wolf conflicts while recognizing diverse wolf values
- Inform and engage the public about wolves in Minnesota and their conservation
- Conduct research to inform wolf management
- Administer the wolf program to fulfill agency responsibilities and public and partner needs



## MN DNR Wolf Plan: Engagement

- Tribal review and consultation



### MN DNR Wolf Plan: Season Framework

- Federally protected (aka "listed") under the Endangered Species Act in 1974
- Wolves have been delisted and relisted several times since 2007
- Minnesota held limited and highly regulated hunting and trapping seasons for wolves; harvest ranged from 200-400 wolves each year from 2012-2014
- The most recent delisting was in 2021, and this decision was subsequently overturned by federal court ruling in 2022
