1.9 "2024" and "2025" used in this article mean that the appropriations listed under them are
1.10 available for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, or June 30, 2025, respectively. "The first
1.11 year" is fiscal year 2024. "The second year" is fiscal year 2025. "The biennium" is fiscal
1.12 years 2024 and 2025.

6.10 (a) The commissioner of management and budget must reduce general fund appropriations
6.11 to the commissioner of corrections by \$165,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$368,000 in fiscal
6.12 year 2025. The commissioner must reduce the base for general fund appropriations to the
6.13 commissioner of corrections by \$460,000 in fiscal year 2026 and \$503,000 in fiscal year
6.14 2027.

6.15 (b) The commissioner of management and budget must reduce general fund appropriations
6.16 to the commissioner of health by \$394,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$781,000 in fiscal year
6.17 2025 for administration of the medical cannabis program.

6.18 (c) The commissioner of management and budget must reduce state government special
6.19 revenue fund appropriations to the commissioner of health by \$1,712,000 in fiscal year
6.20 2024 and \$3,424,000 in fiscal year 2025 for administration of the medical cannabis program.

6.21 **Sec. 21. TRANSFERS.**

6.22 (a) \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2025 are transferred
6.23 from the general fund to the dual training account in the special revenue fund under
6.24 Minnesota Statutes, section 136A.246, subdivision 10, for grants to employers in the legal
6.25 cannabis industry. These are onetime transfers. The commissioner shall give priority to
6.26 applications from employers who are, or who are training employees who are, eligible to
6.27 be social equity applicants under Minnesota Statutes, section 342.16. After June 30, 2025,
6.28 any unencumbered balance from this transfer may be used for grants to any eligible employer
6.29 under Minnesota Statutes, section 136A.246.

6.30 (b) \$4,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$4,000,000 in fiscal year 2025 are transferred
6.31 from the general fund to the substance use treatment, recovery, and prevention grant account
6.32 established under Minnesota Statutes, section 342.72.

7.1 **Sec. 22. APPROPRIATION; DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.**

7.2 \$3,000,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner
7.3 of agriculture for the planning, research, analysis, and other efforts needed to establish the
7.4 Office of Cannabis Management and transition programs, authorities, and responsibilities
7.5 contained in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 342, and implementation activities authorized
7.6 under article 7, section 17. This is a onetime appropriation and is available until June 30,
7.7 2025.

7.8 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment."
