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\$3,000,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of agriculture for the planning, research, analysis, and other efforts needed to establish the Office of Cannabis Management and transition programs, authorities, and responsibilities contained in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 342, and implementation activities authorized under article 7, section 17.
