Mission


To protect the sovereignty of the eleven Minnesota tribes and ensure the well being of all American Indian citizens throughout the state of Minnesota.

The Agency

- Established in 1963 as the first council of its type in the nation
- Authority under MN Stat. 3.922
- Liaison between Tribal Governments and State Government
- Work closely with state agency tribal liaisons
- Plays a central role in the development of state legislation
- Propose Agenda for the Governor's Tribal Leader Summit





Cultural Resources

- MN first state in the nation to collaborate with Tribal Nations regarding protection and preservation of human remains and burial sites
- Authority under:
 - MN Stat. 307.08
 - MN Stat. 138.31 to 138.42
 - PL 101-60
- Works closely with Office of State Archaeologist (OSA) and the Tribal Historic Preservation Officers
- Osteology Lab housed at Hamline University



Language Grants

- Legacy Amendment Arts & Cultural Heritage Fund
- First appropriated in 2009 for the 2010-2011 biennium

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- Just under \$4m Biennial Grant Portfolio
 - Tribal Nations
 - Competitive Grants
 - Immersion
 - Educational Entities
 - Non Profits
 - State Agencies
- Volunteer Language Revitalization Work Group



- This year hosted the 2nd Annual Dakota and Ojibwe Language Symposium
- State of the Languages Reports and Strategic Plan 2011, 2013, and 2016



Tribal State Relations Training



- Partnership between the Tribal Nations, MIAC, MnDOT, & University of Minnesota-Duluth CE,
- Educate state employees regarding Tribal Nations and people
- Build respectful relationships between the state
 and tribal government
- House of Representative Training 2019
- To date have trained 5,113 state employees
