- 1.31 starting July 1, 2024, and each report must be submitted by the 15th of the month following

2.17	(a) To the extent not prohibited by state or federal law, and notwithstanding the data's
2.18	classification under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 13:
2.19	(1) the commissioner of children, youth, and families may access data maintained by
2.20	the commissioners of education, health, human services, and public safety related to the
2.21	responsibilities transferred under section 15 of this act; and
2.22	(2) the commissioners of education, health, human services, and public safety may access
2.23	data maintained by the commissioner of children, youth, and families related to each
2.24	department's respective responsibilities transferred under section 15 of this act.
2.25	(b) Data sharing authorized by this subdivision includes only the data necessary to
2.26	coordinate department activities and services transferred under section 15 of this act.
2.27	(c) Any data shared under this subdivision retain their classification from the agency
2.28	holding the data.
2.29	(d) Existing limitations and legal requirements under chapter 13, including but not limited
2.30	to any applicable data subject consent requirements, apply to any data accessed, transferred,
2.31	disseminated, or shared under this subdivision.

- 3.6 And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on Health
