1.8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.10	BILL DOOLEY BICYCLE SAFETY ACT
1.11	Section 1. <u>TITLE.</u>
1.12	This act may be cited as the "Bill Dooley Bicycle Safety Act."
1.13	ARTICLE 2
1.14	SCHOOL-RELATED ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION
1.15	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 123B.90, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
1.16	Subd. 2. Student training. (a) Each district must provide public school pupils enrolled
1.17	in kindergarten through grade 10 with age-appropriate school bus safety training, as described
1.18	in this section, of the following concepts:
1.19	(1) transportation by school bus is a privilege and not a right;
1.20	(2) district policies for student conduct and school bus safety;
1.21	(3) appropriate conduct while on the school bus;
1.22	(4) the danger zones surrounding a school bus;

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- 2.1 (5) procedures for safely boarding and leaving a school bus;
 2.2 (6) procedures for safe street or road crossing; and
- 2.3 (7) school bus evacuation.

(b) Each nonpublic school located within the district must provide all nonpublic school
pupils enrolled in kindergarten through grade 10 who are transported by school bus at public
expense and attend school within the district's boundaries with training as required in
paragraph (a).

(c) Students enrolled in kindergarten through grade 6 who are transported by school bus 2.8 and are enrolled during the first or second week of school must receive the school bus safety 2.9 training competencies by the end of the third week of school. Students enrolled in grades 2.10 7 through 10 who are transported by school bus and are enrolled during the first or second 2.11 week of school and have not previously received school bus safety training must receive 2.12 the training or receive bus safety instructional materials by the end of the sixth week of 2.13 school. Students taking driver's training instructional classes must receive training in the 2.14 laws and proper procedures when operating a motor vehicle in the vicinity of a school bus 2.15 as required by section 169.446, subdivisions 2 and 3. Students enrolled in kindergarten 2.16 through grade 10 who enroll in a school after the second week of school and are transported 2.17 by school bus and have not received training in their previous school district shall undergo 2.18 school bus safety training or receive bus safety instructional materials within four weeks 2.19 of the first day of attendance. Upon request of the superintendent of schools, the school 2.20 transportation safety director in each district must certify to the superintendent that all 2.21 students transported by school bus within the district have received the school bus safety 2.22 training according to this section. Upon request of the superintendent of the school district 2.23 where the nonpublic school is located, the principal or other chief administrator of each 2.24 nonpublic school must certify to the school transportation safety director of the district in 2.25 2.26 which the school is located that the school's students transported by school bus at public expense have received training according to this section. 2.27

(d) A district and a nonpublic school with students transported by school bus at public
expense may provide kindergarten pupils with bus safety training before the first day of
school.

2.31 (e) A district and a nonpublic school with students transported by school bus at public
 2.32 expense may also provide student safety education for bicycling and pedestrian safety, for
 2.33 students enrolled in kindergarten through grade 5.

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3.1	(f) (e) A district and a nonpublic school with students transported by school bus at public
3.2	expense must make reasonable accommodations for the school bus safety training of pupils
3.3	known to speak English as a second language and pupils with disabilities.

- 3.4 (g) (f) The district and a nonpublic school with students transported by school bus at
 3.5 public expense must provide students enrolled in kindergarten through grade 3 school bus
 3.6 safety training twice during the school year.
- 3.7 (h)(g) A district and a nonpublic school with students transported by school bus at public 3.8 expense must conduct a school bus evacuation drill at least once during the school year.

- 3.22 (c) A nonpublic school may provide nonpublic school pupils enrolled in kindergarten
- 3.23 through grade 8 with training as specified in paragraphs (a) and (b).

5.2 Subd. 1b. **State bicycle routes.** The commissioner of transportation must identify state 5.3 bicycle routes primarily on existing road right-of-way and trails. State bicycle routes must 5.4 be identified in cooperation with road and trail authorities, including the commissioner of 5.5 natural resources and with the advice of the active transportation advisory committee under 5.6 <u>section 174.375</u>. In a metropolitan area, state bicycle routes must be identified in coordination 5.7 with the plans and priorities established by metropolitan planning organizations, as defined 5.8 in United States Code, title 23, section 134.

5.9 Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 160.266, subdivision 6, is amended to read:

Subd. 6. Mississippi River Trail. The Mississippi River Trail bikeway is designated as 5.10 a state bicycle route. 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(c) Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway or shoulder shall <u>must</u> not ride more than
two abreast and shall not impede the normal and reasonable movement of traffic and, on a
laned roadway, shall ride within a single lane.

(d) A person operating a bicycle upon a sidewalk, or across a roadway or shoulder on a
crosswalk, shall must yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and shall give an audible
signal when necessary before overtaking and passing any pedestrian. No <u>A</u> person shall
<u>must not</u> ride a bicycle upon a sidewalk within a business district unless permitted by local
authorities. Local authorities may prohibit the operation of bicycles on any sidewalk or
crosswalk under their jurisdiction.

(e) An individual operating a bicycle or other vehicle on a bikeway shall must (1) give
an audible signal a safe distance prior to overtaking a bicycle or individual, (2) leave a safe
clearance distance when overtaking a bicycle or individual proceeding in the same direction
on the bikeway, and shall (3) maintain clearance until safely past the overtaken bicycle or
individual.
