Bill Description

The bill modifies the special farm products permit to allow soybean oil as a qualifying agricultural product.

Assumptions

An industry official is aware of three plants which would each require one permit. Depending on the number of axles, the permits cost either \$300 or \$500 annually. MnDOT assumes there would be few or no other permits needed, so the additional permit revenue would be immaterial. There would be no additional costs.
