| 1.8 | Subd. 8. Awarding of grants. For grants awarded pursuant to a two-year grant contract, |
| 1.9 | the commissioner shall permit grant recipients to carry over any unexpended amount from |
| 1.10 | the first contract year to the second contract year. |
| 1.11 | Sec. 2. <u>TITLE.</u> |
| 1.12 | This act shall be known as the "Pathway Home Act." |
| 1.13 | Sec. 3. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS. |
| 1.14 | Subdivision 1. Emergency services grants. \$20,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 and |
| 1.15 | \$20,000,000 in fiscal year 2025 are appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner |

- 2.31 general fund to the commissioner for grants to eligible applicants for the acquisition of
- 2.32 property; site preparation, including demolition; predesign; design; construction; renovation;
- 2.33 <u>furnishing</u>; and equipping of emergency shelter facilities in accordance with subdivision 3.
