1.7	Section 1. [144.6504] ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND DEMENTIA CARE
1.8	TRAINING PROGRAM.
1.9	(a) The commissioner of health, in collaboration with interested stakeholders, shall
1.10	develop and provide a training program for community health workers on recognizing and
1.11	understanding Alzheimer's disease and dementia. The training program may be conducted
1.12	either virtually or in person and must, at a minimum, include instruction on:
1.13	(1) recognizing the common warning signs of Alzheimer's disease and dementia;
1.14	(2) understanding how Alzheimer's disease and dementia affect communication and
1.15	behavior;
1.16	(3) recognizing potential safety risks for individuals living with dementia, including the
1.17	risks of wandering and elder abuse; and
1.18	(4) identifying appropriate techniques to communicate with individuals living with
1.19	dementia and how to appropriately respond to dementia-related behaviors.
1.20	(b) The commissioner shall work with the Minnesota State Colleges and University
1.21	System (MNSCU) to explore the possibility of including a training program that meets the
