1.7	(a) \$10,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$10,000,000 in fiscal year 2025 are appropriated
1.8	from the general fund to the commissioner of human services for human services provider
1.9	workplace safety grants to increase safety measures in human services workplaces providing
1.10	behavioral health care; services for children, families, and vulnerable adults; services for
1.11	older adults and people with disabilities; and other social services or related care.
1.12	(b) Eligible applicants include county human services agencies, Tribal human services
1.13	agencies, or other human services provider organizations or agencies.
1.14	(c) Applicants shall submit applications in a form and manner prescribed by the
1.15	commissioner. Applications must include:
1.16	(1) a description of the type of provider organization that will receive funding through
1.17	the grant;

3.3	(e) Grants must be awarded to eligible applicants who meet application requirements
3.4	on a first-come, first-served basis, and 40 percent of grant funds in each fiscal year must be
3.5	awarded to eligible agencies or organizations located outside of the seven-county
3.6	metropolitan area. Each grant award must be for at least \$5,000, but no more than \$50,000.
3.7	(f) Each grantee must submit a report to the commissioner within two years of receiving
3.8	grant funding under this section on the effectiveness of the safety measures funded by these
3.9	grants. Reports to the commissioner must include an attestation from each grantee providing:
3.10	(1) the number of workplace safety incidents that occurred over the course of the grant
3.11	period;
3.12	(2) the number and type of safety measures funded by the grants; and
3.13	(3) the number of employees benefiting from safety measures implemented through
3.14	grant funding.
3.15	(g) The commissioner must provide technical assistance to grant applicants throughout
3.16	the application process and to applicants and grantees regarding grant distribution and
3.17	required grantee reporting.
3.18	(h) The unencumbered balance in the first year does not cancel but is available for the
3.19	second year.
3.20	(i) These are onetime appropriations.
