- 1.18 individual subject to a background study under this chapter for accessing or providing
- 1.19 reproductive health care services, as defined in section 147.091, subdivision 1c.
- 1.20 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment."
- 1.21 Renumber the sections in sequence
- 1.22 Amend the title numbers accordingly
- 1.23 And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on Judiciary
- 1.24 and Public Safety. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.
