

1.1 **Senator Wiklund from the Committee on Health and Human Services, to which**
1.2 **was referred**

1.3 **S.F. No. 165:** A bill for an act relating to health care; limiting the release of health
1.4 records in cases related to reproductive health; prohibiting certain acts by certain
1.5 health-related licensing boards; preventing the enforcement of certain judgments related to
1.6 reproductive health; restricting the enforcement of subpoenas issued in cases related to
1.7 reproductive health; creating a cause of action for penalties and court costs for lawsuits
1.8 related to reproductive health; prohibiting extradition of persons charged in another state
1.9 for acts committed or services received in Minnesota related to reproductive health; amending
1.10 Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 147.091, by adding a subdivision; 147A.13, by adding
1.11 a subdivision; 148.261, by adding a subdivision; 629.02; 629.05; 629.06; 629.13; 629.14;
1.12 proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapters 144; 548; 604.

1.13 Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

1.14 Page 3, after line 23, insert:

1.15 "Sec. 5. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 245C.15, is amended by adding a subdivision
1.16 to read:


1.17 Subd. 6. **Reproductive health care services.** The commissioner may not disqualify an
1.18 individual subject to a background study under this chapter for accessing or providing
1.19 reproductive health care services, as defined in section 147.091, subdivision 1c.

1.20 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment."

1.21 Renumber the sections in sequence

1.22 Amend the title numbers accordingly

1.23 And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on Judiciary
1.24 and Public Safety. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.
