My name is Pastor Richard Pittman Sr., and I am the President of the St. Paul NAACP. As you are aware, the NAACP is the largest and most recognized civil rights organization in the nation. Since our founding in 1909, we have been at the forefront of the fight for equality and social justice. The St Paul NAACP branch is one of the oldest in the country founded in 1913 by Frederick L. McGhee the first black attorney in the state of Minnesota.

I am writing this letter in support of the Emmett Louis Till Victims Recovery Program Senate Bill SF18. After decades of inaction, the NAACP commended the federal government for finally passing legislation that criminalize lynching as the shameful instrument of terror used to intimidate and oppress African Americans. In the 1930's the National Headquarters of the NAACP would hang a flag with the words "A man was lynched yesterday." In 1955, Emmett Till a 14 year old child was beaten, tortured and murdered by a gang of white supremist who dumped his body into the Tallahatchie River. The federal government is only now acknowledging the historical fact of widespread lynching whose memory continues to haunt Black communities.

We are proud to see that Minnesota is one of the first states to address the historical trauma faced by the victims, their families and heirs. Historical trauma based upon the violent death of a family member, assault, false accusations and wrongful convictions have a profound impact on the victim's mental, emotional and physical health. Untreated the trauma could lead to suicides, stroke, heart attacks or other serious consequences.
