Foster Success Expansion

CREATING COLLEGE & CAREER PATHWAYS FOR FOSTERS

In 2021, **83%** of Minnesota students graduated from high school in the traditional four years. Meanwhile, only **37%** of their Foster peers were able to achieve the same success.

We know Fosters face significant barriers when it comes to educational success, such as **unstable housing**, **food insecurity**, and **multiple school disruptions**. There are many barriers, yet no organizations provide the necessary wraparound, trauma-informed interventions and support.

In Fall 2022, **over 364 Fosters** benefited from the new <u>Fostering Higher</u> <u>Independence Act</u>! The elimination of financial barriers to higher education is critical, but that is simply the first step. Fosters need intervention **early on**, and we aim to do just that.

Support Fosters by supporting SF 1295

A one-time, \$1 million appropriation will expand our Foster Success program <u>statewide</u> and ensure every Foster, ages 16-27, will have access to a coach with lived experience who can provide:

- 1:1 mentoring to support their education journey through high school, through college and onto other career pathways
- Foster specific housing education and navigation of existing resources in their community
- workforce readiness coaching and financial literacy training
