
INVESTING AND RECRUITING MINNESOTA'S FUTURE ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONALS

- SF 1288 (Putnam) establishes a one-time program for students newly enrolled in an accredited allied health technician program in Minnesota starting with the 2024-2025 academic school year.
- Each scholarship will total \$5,000 with the goal to award 1,000 scholarships to individuals pursuing a career as a medical laboratory professional, respiratory therapist, radiology technician, or surgical technician.
- The proposed scholarship program is modeled after the successful "1,000 Certified Nursing Assistant" program within the Office of Higher Education.

There are currently over 7,000 vacancies in allied health occupations.

- The Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) estimates that there are currently 52,000 total health care job vacancies in the state, including over 7,000 vacancies in allied health occupations.
- Allied health vacancies are projected to dramatically increase.
 - There are currently 2,100 open positions for medical laboratory professionals, respiratory therapists, radiology technicians, and surgical technicians. This number will only continue to grow, with an additional 10,000 vacancies for these professionals projected between now and 2030.
