On behalf of the GroundBreak Coalition, we want to thank you for your work throughout this legislative session.

The GroundBreak Coalition is made up of corporate, civic, and philanthropic leaders committed to demonstrating that with enough resources, a racially equitable and carbon-neutral future is possible now – first in Minneapolis-Saint Paul (MSP) and then across the state and the country. The coalition aims to both increase investment in Minnesota and change how capital shows up in communities, making it more equitable and sustainable. The GroundBreak Coalition is building a platform to mobilize and aggregate capital to achieve racial equity and climate readiness. We will provide pathways for corporations, financial institutions, government, philanthropy, and even individuals to equitably and efficiently invest in Minnesota – making good on the commitments to racial equity and carbon neutrality that so many have made in recent years. We call on the legislature to do their part and invest in a stronger and more equitable Minnesota, and thank you in advance for considering these important proposals.
