To: Senate Human Services Committee Re: Human Services Omnibus Bill

Dear Chair Hoffman and members of the Human Services Committee,

Our organizations are thankful for your ongoing efforts to build a human services budget that will promote the health and well-being of all Minnesotans. We are grateful for your leadership as you make difficult decisions about this final budget as it will have immediate and long-term impacts on our communities.

We write to you today regarding a provision in the Human Services Omnibus Bill that is of shared interest amongst our organizations – developing Life Sharing as medical assistance waiver service. Life Sharing is a relationship-based living arrangement that carefully matches a person with a disability with an individual or family who opens their home and shares their experience with the person they support. Life Sharing is a proven model, and research shows that by living with a family, a person with disabilities has the opportunity to participate in all desired aspects of family and community life.

We applaud the promotion of this innovative, person-centered service model that supports independent living and has the potential to mitigate the impact of the workforce crisis on people with disabilities. Thank you for including development of this service in consultation with providers, people with disabilities, advocacy organizations, and lead agencies. We are deeply committed to removing barriers to accessing this service and building continued sustainability for individuals and providers.
