Program Offerings in the 6 Career Clusters

CareerSTART is a locally developed program by Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Minnesota which provides exploration, development and application of career paths for youth in grades K-12. Youth develop employability skills & apply core competencies that will empower them to start their great future in the career of their choice.

Boys & Girls Club partners with numerous community organizations to provide the three stages of CareerSTART.

EXPLORE: Clubs offer field trips and career speakers in age-appropriate groups on a monthly basis. Careers are featured regularly to provide a career-driven strategy across our programs.

DEVELOP: As youth enter middle school, they have the opportunity to develop career readiness skills, with programs like Career Launch, Money Matters, and Junior Staff Career Development. The Club also offers culinary trades, construction trades, CNA (Certified Nursing Assistant), Teen Tech Teams, VEX Robotics and CEO (Creating Entrepreneurial Opportunities) programs.

APPLY: High school students meet with Club mentors to apply for work outside the Club, internships, and post-secondary education. Youth who complete all Career-START components are eligible for a CareerPROMISE scholarship to attend St. Cloud Technical and Community College.

Junior Staff Career Development assists Club members in exploring a career in youth of human services, particularly Boys & Girls Club work. Through hands-on experience with helping others in the Club & community, field trips to other service organizations & guidance from Club staff, youth prepare for future roles as human service professionals or volunteer leaders in their community.

Health, Science & Technology

The CNA Program (Certified Nursing Assistant) supports Boys & Girls Club members interested in exploring education, internship, work & career opportunities in the health care & long-term care fields. Boys & Girls Club youth receive their CNA certification & a stipend necessary to begin their career in the health care field. The program uses VR for additional program exposure in the health sciences.

Engineering, Manufacturing & Technology



Robotics provides an opportunity for Club youth to learn STEM principles in the comfort of the Club environment. Robotics encourages creativity, teamwork, leadership, and problem solving.

Construction Trades program gives youth the opportunity to learn about construction and manufacturing using hands-on skill development with industry professionals and experienced staff.

Arts, Communication & Information Systems



Virtual Reality gives youth hands-on opportunities to explore careers in 56 modules using VR. **Digital Technology** explores technology careers, increases technology skills, and assists with technology in the Club. Youth explore coding, video game design and more. Digital Arts provides an opportunity for youth to learn how to produce digital music, videos and photography using current equipment and technology, including Adobe Suite.

Agriculture, Food & Natural Resources



Culinary Arts provides an opportunity for youth to learn about careers in the food service industry with hands-on activities in the Club's commercial kitchens. They become food safety "certified" and learn how to prepare, cook and serve healthy meals in age-appropriate, small-group settings.

Business, Management & Administration



CEO Program (Creating Entrepreneurial Opportunities) - this program provides youth with their first entrepreneurial experience. They work with business owners in the community to learn how to build a business. The group works to determine a product to sell, and they learn how to produce, market and sell the product.

Human Services
