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## S.F. No. 1720 – Small business partnership program codification

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**Date:** February 24, 2023

**S.F. 1720** codifies the small business partnership program, which has operated previously as an uncodified business development competitive grant program.

Section 1. **Small business partnership program.** Subdivision 1. Definitions. Provides definitions for terms used for the program. Defines "eligible business" as a commercial cooperative, employee-owned business, or commercial land trust that is either located in greater Minnesota, in the high-tech field, or at least 51 percent owned by people who are Black, Indigenous, People of Color, women, immigrants, veterans, low-income, or people with disabilities.

Subdivision 2. **Establishment.** Creates the small business partnership program to award to make statewide grants to local and regional community-based nonprofit organizations to support the start-up, growth, and success of eligible businesses through high-quality free or low-cost professional business development and technical assistance services.

Subdivision 3. **Grants to nonprofits.** Specifies that grants shall be awarded through a competitive process. Allows up to ten percent of the grant award to be used for administrative expenses. Stipulates a preference for applications from nonprofits that can demonstrate a successful record of serving historically underserved communities or increasing the upward economic mobility of clients.

Subdivision 4. **Administration.** Allows the commissioner of employment and economic development to use up to five percent of the appropriation for administration of the program.

Subdivision 5. **Reporting.** Requires grant recipients to report annually to the commissioner. Beginning in 2025, requires the commissioner to submit a biennial report to the legislature providing details on the use of program funds and the program's impact.

Section 2. **Appropriation.** Makes an appropriation from the general fund to the commissioner of employment and economic development for the small business partnership program.
