Senator Ron Latz called the meeting to order at 12:33p

S.F. 1138: Senator Klein: Direct-to-consumer genetic testing companies requirement to provide disclosure notices and obtain consent.

Oral Amendment Page 4, line 11, before “The” insert “(a)”, Page 4, after line 12 insert: “(b) This section does not supersede the requirements and rights described in section 13.386 or the remedies available under Chapter 13 for violations of section 13.386.”

Senator Westlin moved that S.F. 1138, as amended, recommended to pass and re-referred to the Commerce and Consumer Protection Committee. - **MOTION PREVAILED.**

S.F. 294: Senator Gustafson: Crime of surreptitious intrusion that does not take place through a window or aperture establishment; crime of surreptitious intrusion under a persons clothing establishment; statute of limitations for the crime of surreptitious intrusion modification.

Oral amendment – Add on line 10.19, after “date”, “and to crimes committed before that date if the limitations period for the crime did not expire before August 1st 2023.” – adopted by voice vote

Senator Seeberger moved that S.F. 427, be recommended to pass. - **MOTION PREVAILED.**


S.F. 133: Senator Oumou Verbeten: Labor trafficking provisions modifications.
