1.7	(a) The superintendent must prepare an annual report for the public and the legislature
1.8	on the Minnesota Fusion Center (MNFC) that includes general information about the MNFC;
1.9	the types of activities it monitors; the scale of information it collects; the local, state, and
1.10	federal agencies with which it shares information; and the quantifiable benefits it produces.
1.11	None of the reporting requirements in this section supersede chapter 13 or any other state
1.12	or federal law. The superintendent must report on activities for the preceding calendar year
1.13	unless another time period is specified. The report must include the following information,
1.14	to the extent allowed by other law:
1.15	(1) the MNFC's operating budget for the current biennium, number of staff, and staff
1.16	duties;
1.17	(2) the number of publications generated and an overview of the type of information
1.18	provided in the publications, including products such as law enforcement briefs, partner
1.19	briefs, risk assessments, threat assessments, and operational reports;
