1.7	homes. \$5,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 is appropriated from the general fund to the
1.8	commissioner of corrections for a grant to Ramsey County to establish at least five and up
1.9	to seven culturally specific, community-based intensive therapeutic treatment homes in
1.10	Ramsey County that provide up to 25 out-of-home, community-based placement options
1.11	for Ramsey County youth who have been adjudicated delinquent. This is a onetime
1.12	appropriation.
1.13	Subd. 2. Ramsey County violence prevention and wellness support. \$10,000,000 in
1.14	fiscal year 2024 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of corrections
1.15	for a grant to Ramsey County to award grants to develop new and further enhance existing
1.16	community-based organizational support through violence prevention and community
1.17	wellness grants. Grantees must use the money to:
1.18	(1) create family support groups and resources to support families during the time a
