They are the tireless parents of two young women whose cases display the injustice of the current structure of the felony murder laws that punish people who had no intent to cause death to the victim but got pulled along by an accomplice who did have murderous intent. For those two classes of people to be punished the same defeats all purposes of deterrence, punishment, and rehabilitation that are the core of our criminal justice system. SF 1478 addresses that injustice by requiring that the accomplice have the same intent to cause death as the principal person committing the murder in order for them to face the same criminal punishment. Making it retroactive is an important piece to ensuring that past injustices are corrected, like those faced by the families that have advocated for this reform.
