1.6	Subd. 3. Burglary in the third degree. (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
1.7	whoever enters a building without consent and with intent to steal or commit any felony or
1.8	gross misdemeanor while in the building, or enters a building without consent and steals or
1.9	commits a felony or gross misdemeanor while in the building, either directly or as an
1.10	accomplice, commits burglary in the third degree and may be sentenced to imprisonment
1.11	for not more than five years or to payment of a fine of not more than \$10,000, or both.
1.12	(b) Whoever enters a building that is open to the public, other than a building identified
1.13	in subdivision 2, paragraph (b), with intent to steal while in the building, or enters a building
1.14	that is open to the public, other than a building identified in subdivision 2, paragraph (b),
1.15	and steals while in the building, either directly or as an accomplice, commits burglary in
1.16	the third degree and may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than five years or to
1.17	payment of a fine of not more than \$10,000, or both, if:
1.18	(1) the person enters the building within one year after being told to leave the building
