1.3 **S.F. No. 1657:** A bill for an act relating to data practices; classifying data for licenses
1.4 issued by local governments; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 13.41, subdivision
1.5 1.

1.6 Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

1.7 Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

1.8 "Section 1. **[13.204] POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS LICENSING DATA.**

1.9 (a) The following data submitted to a political subdivision by a person seeking to obtain
1.10 a license are classified as private data on individuals or nonpublic data:

1.11 (1) a tax return, as defined by section 270B.01, subdivision 2; and

1.12 (2) a bank account statement.

1.13 (b) Notwithstanding section 138.17, data collected by a political subdivision as part of
1.14 a license application and classified under paragraph (a) must be destroyed no later than 90
1.15 days after a final decision on the license application.

1.16 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment. Data
1.17 which a political subdivision collected or created before the effective date of this section,
1.18 and which would otherwise be subject to the destruction requirement in paragraph (b), must
1.19 be destroyed no later than 90 days following final enactment."

1.20 Amend the title numbers accordingly

1.21 And when so amended the bill do pass. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.
