

1.1 **Senator Latz from the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety, to which was**
1.2 **re-referred**

1.3 **S.F. No. 1526:** A bill for an act relating to animal health; modifying requirements for
1.4 certain owners of farmed Cervidae; prohibiting certain registrations; establishing civil
1.5 liability; requiring live-animal testing for chronic wasting disease; transferring certain duties
1.6 from the Board of Animal Health to the commissioner of natural resources; appropriating
1.7 money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 35.155, subdivisions 1, 4, 6, 10, 11,
1.8 12, by adding subdivisions; 35.156, by adding subdivisions.

1.9 Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

1.10 Page 5, line 4, after "titles" insert "as appropriate, in the county where the premises is
1.11 located,"

1.12 Page 5, line 5, after "board" insert "which meets the recording requirements of sections
1.13 507.093 and 507.24" and delete "location" and insert "nearest address" and before "legal"
1.14 insert "the"

1.15 Page 5, line 7, after the period, insert "The legal description shall be the legal description
1.16 of record with the county recorder or registrar of titles and shall not otherwise be the real
1.17 estate tax statement legal description for the premises. The notice expires and has no effect
1.18 ten years after the date of detection stated in the notice. An expired notice shall be omitted
1.19 by the registrar of titles from future certificates of title."

1.20 Page 5, line 13, before "infected" and insert "if the herd owner knew or reasonably should
1.21 have known that the farmed cervidae was"

1.22 And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on
1.23 Agriculture, Broadband, and Rural Development. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.
