

1.1 **Senator Latz from the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety, to which was**
1.2 **re-referred**

1.3 **S.F. No. 2099:** A bill for an act relating to transportation; driver and vehicle services;
1.4 establishing full-service providers; allowing full-service providers to provide copies of
1.5 certain driver and vehicle records; increasing filing fees for driver's license applications;
1.6 eliminating requirement for new Minnesota residents to take written driver's license exam;
1.7 modifying provisions regarding access to driver and vehicle services information system;
1.8 making various changes to driver and vehicle services procedures; requiring reports;
1.9 appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 168.002, by adding a
1.10 subdivision; 168.327, subdivisions 1, 2, 3, by adding a subdivision; 168.33, subdivision 7;
1.11 168.345, subdivision 2; 169.09, subdivision 13, by adding a subdivision; 171.01, by adding
1.12 a subdivision; 171.06, by adding a subdivision; 171.061, subdivision 4; 171.0705, by adding
1.13 a subdivision; 171.12, subdivision 1a; 171.13, subdivisions 1, 1a; 299A.705, subdivisions
1.14 1, 3, by adding a subdivision; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapters
1.15 171; 299A.

1.16 Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

1.17 Page 11, after line 33, insert:

1.18 "(f) An individual whose access was permanently revoked under this section between
1.19 October 1, 2018, and September 30, 2023, based on the commissioner's determination that
1.20 the individual willfully entered, updated, accessed, shared, or disseminated data in violation
1.21 of state or federal law, may apply to the commissioner for reinstatement of their access. An
1.22 individual convicted of a crime related to the conduct that resulted in permanent revocation
1.23 of their access is ineligible to reapply for access under this section. Any individual reapplying
1.24 for access must submit the request in writing to the commissioner no later than June 30,
1.25 2024, and the request must contain:

1.26 (1) written documentation that demonstrates the individual is currently employed at an
1.27 agency or entity that requires access for the employee to conduct their work duties;

1.28 (2) written documentation that demonstrates the individual is in compliance with all
1.29 existing requirements to be considered eligible for access, including completion of required
1.30 background checks;

1.31 (3) a signed statement from their employer acknowledging the employer is aware that
1.32 the individual's access was previously revoked and any future violations of state or federal
1.33 law may again result in permanent revocation of access; and


1.34 (4) a signed statement from the individual describing:

1.35 (i) their understanding of appropriate use of the system data under state and federal laws;
1.36 and

1.37 (ii) the remedial steps they have taken to ensure no future misuse occurs.

2.1 The commissioner must respond in writing to the individual's request for access within 90
 2.2 days of receipt of the request. The commissioner's decision under this section is final and
 2.3 an individual applying under this section is not entitled to further review."

2.4 And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on
 2.5 Transportation. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.
