	We want to thank Chair Wiklund for authoring S.F. 1681, as amended, which would establish new regulations to prevent further corporatization and consolidation of the healthcare delivery system – which negatively impacts the accessibility and affordability of healthcare services, particularly in rural and lower-income communities, and often leads to services being reduced or the closure of hospitals and clinics. Among other provisions, MNA supports this bill because it:

	MNA urges the passage of this bill because nurses and other healthcare workers continue to be asked to do more and more with less and less, meanwhile healthcare executives rake in record salaries and bonuses. And as consumers and taxpayers, more transparency is needed over charitable assets, particularly when these publicly supported systems are largely delivered through nonprofit providers established to serve the public good. S.F. 1681, as amended with the language of H.F. 402, will help us meet the moment and better address this ongoing crisis in healthcare.
