FACILITY STATS

• 83,333 square feet total. 41,183 square feet for Rice County Sheriff's Office, 42,151 for the 76-bed jail. Another 19,800 square feet for the adjacent Storage Facility/Training Space.

• Entire Public Safety Center will utilize a system designed to limit spread of viruses, harmful fumes or substances.

JAIL

Design focuses on staff and detainee safety and well-being. With most detainees having mental/chemical health issues, the facility addresses those needs with natural light, color, and space to learn, relieve stress and prepare to return to the community.

- Flexible cell area allows space to meet the needs of an ever-changing population.
- 10x the amount of recreational and programming space meets DOC standards, allows detainees to remain physically active and reduce stress. Rec space includes a large open area and some equipment.
- Computer lab and classroom space for classes and small group activities.
- **Dedicated medical/mental health unit** to segregate detainees in need.
- Indirect supervision of detainees provides

two levels of security.

- Centralized control over all entrances permits detainees to move unescorted.
- Two intake **holding units** and prebook area for arresting officers enhance security.
- **Body scanner** to determine if incoming detainee has ingested dangerous substances.
- Larger sally port can accommodate most any vehicle, including ambulances.
- Staff break room inside secured portion of facility.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE & TRAINING/STORAGE SPACE

- Three meeting rooms for training or meetings, or hosting outside agencies.
- Separate entrances for the public, work release and bail bondsmen offers improved traffic flow
- · Improved evidence storage area.
- **Dedicated offices/work stations** for every deputy and staff member, and some room to expand.
- 1,800 square feet of **on-site training space**, including use-of-force training area for deputies and K9s. Building includes kennel space for K9s.

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PUBLIC SAFETY CENTER PROJECT TIMELINE

JULY 26, 2019 State Department of Corrections notifies county it's downgrading the county's main jail to a 90-day facility.

JULY 30, 2019
Board of Commissioners approves issuing an RFP for a study of the jail and improvements needed to meet DOC requirements.

APRIL 28, 2020
Board appoints task force to work with consultants Klein McCarthy Architects on fall study

FEB. 9, 2021
Jail study presented to the board.
Study looks at expanding on site
adjacent to Main Jail and Jail Annex
site, and building new.

APRIL 2021

Board holds two public meetings to discuss jail study and consider options presented.

APRIL 6, 2021
Board discusses partnership with
Steele County on its jail. DOC officials
say available Steele Co. beds misleading and it can't meet Rice Co.'s needs.

MAY 4, 2021 Board votes to build a new Public Safety Center on an undeveloped site

SEPT. 14, 2021 Board approves purchase of 109.2 acres off Hwy. 3 at 30th Street in Faribault for \$1.65M. A portion will be the site of the new Public Safety Center.

JAN. 31, 2022 Board votes to seek legislative approval to put a .375% sales tax referendum on November ballot. Funds would help pay for safety center.

MARCH 22, 2022
Board approves Public Safety Center design development plan, estimate and platting proposal

APRIL 12, 2022
County staff receives board authorization to let bids for construction of Public Safety

JUNE 7, 2022 Board approves \$32.9 million in bids for construction of Safety Center. Two items need to be rebid.

JULY 2, 2022 \$2.165 million bid to build storage facility at PSC awarded to Met-Con Construction.

JULY 19, 2022 Board OKs \$48.86 million bond sale (3.78% interest rate) to finance Public Safety Center as well as \$1.43 million bid for concrete

AUG. 9, 2022 Public Safety Center groundbreaking; construction begins.

NOVEMBER 2022 Construction of storage/training facility at PSC site and installation of 8'x20' pre-cast concrete walls begins.

FALL 2024 Safety Center complete.
