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S.F. No. 4026—Requirements for cell-cultured meat and cell-cultured poultry

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SF 4026 amends the food chapter by inserting new definitions and labeling requirements for cell-cultured meat and cell-cultured poultry.

Section 1 (31.01) adds a new definition of cell-cultured meat to mean a meat food product grown using animal cell technology that extracts a small number of cells from a living animal and grows the cells in a controlled environment.

Section 2 (31.01) adds a new definition of cell-cultured poultry to mean a poultry food product grown using animal cell technology that extracts a small number of cells from a living animal and grows the cells in a controlled environment.

Section 3 (31.12) amends labeling requirements so that a product label must state if it contains cell-cultured meat or cell-cultured poultry and makes clarifying technical changes regarding the commissioner's enforcement of the rules.

Section 4 (31.633) requires that it be noted on a menu if a product on offer at a restaurant or similar establishment contains cell-cultured meat or cell-cultured poultry.

Section 5 (31A.02) amends the definition of "Meat food product; poultry food product" to include cell-cultured meat and cell-cultured poultry.
