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S.F. No. 4291—Requirements for cell-cultured and insect food products

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SF 4291 is a one section bill that adds a new section to the meat statutes in the food chapter [31.641] containing requirements for cell-cultured products and insect protein.

Subdivision 1 cites the short title as the “G.R.O.S.S. Act.”

Subdivision 2 contains definitions for cell-cultured product, close proximity, and insect product.

Subdivision 3 requires cell-cultured products to be labeled in prominent type and in close proximity to the name of the product.

Subdivision 4 requires insect products to be labeled in prominent type and in close proximity to the name of the product. The ingredient list must contain the common and scientific name of each insect in the product.

Subdivision 5 prohibits retail sales of cell-cultured products or insect products unless the product is properly labeled and displayed separately from all other food products.

Subdivision 6 prohibits restaurants and similar establishments from selling food containing a cell-cultured product or insect product unless it is identified on the menu and is stored, cooked, and prepared separately from all other food.
