Bill Description

This bill is relating to agriculture, modifying provisions related to food product sampling and demonstration at farmers' markets and community events.

This bill amends Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 28A.151, subdivisions 1, 2, 3, and 5, and adds a subdivision 7.

This bill clarifies definitions and requirements for food used for sampling and demonstration. It also clarifies no cost to the recipient of a sample and when a handwashing device is not needed. This bill requires signage that lists ingredients and major allergens in foods used for sampling and demonstration.

Assumptions

Passage of this bill will not significantly fiscally impact the MDA Food and Feed Safety Division (FFSD) or Dairy and Meat Inspection Division (DMID) programs. The FFSD and DMID will update existing outreach, compliance assessment, enforcement, and reporting business processes referencing this law using existing program maintenance processes and protection services general funds. Costs would be minor/immaterial.
