S.F. No. 3345 – Ban on Mercury-Containing Lighting

S.F. 3345 defines “compact fluorescent lamp,” “linear fluorescent lamp,” “mercury vapor lamp,” “mercury vapor lamp ballast,” “specialty application,” and “mercury vapor lamp ballast.”

Effective January 1, 2025, a person may not sell, offer for sale, or distribute a screw or bayonet base compact fluorescent lamp, a mercury vapor lamp, or a mercury vapor lamp ballast.

Effective January 1, 2026, a person may not sell, offer for sale, or distribute in the state as a new manufactured product a pin-base type compact fluorescent lamp or a linear fluorescent lamp.

This bill provides for several exceptions including but not limited to a lamp made for photocopying, printing, or video projecting.
