Bill Description

The bill would grant the Department new permissible authority to enforce net neutrality and other consumer protections against Internet Service Providers (ISPs). These protections include prohibitions on degrading or impeding lawful internet traffic, interfering with a customer's ability to access lawful internet content or to use the device of their choosing to access such content, and prohibitions on deceptive marketing practices relating to the ISP's net neutrality practices.

Assumptions

Investigating and bringing enforcement action against ISPs based on violations of net neutrality laws would require subject matter expertise in a complex and novel area, including a thorough understanding of how ISP algorithms operate, and how to request relevant data from ISPs. Accordingly, the Department assumes that investigations into compliance with the law would be complicated and may require significant data collection and analysis. Commerce assumes that many complaints may be referred to federal authorities.

The bill allows permissive enforcement, not mandatory enforcement by the Department of Commerce.

Bill Description

Section 1 requires internet service providers to comply with net neutrality principles with respect to Minnesota consumers. The Commissioner of Commerce may enforce this provision by filing a civil action.

Assumptions

The Attorney General's Office provides legal representation to the Department of Commerce. As Commerce is assuming that they will not be bringing any enforcement actions, the AGO will not have any costs associated with this bill. If Commerce decides to bring enforcement actions in the future, the AGO would likely also have costs.
