S.F. 3711 defines “broadband internet access service,” “edge provider,” “impairing or degrading lawful internet traffic on the basis of internet content, application, or service, or use of a nonharmful device,” “internet service provider,” “paid prioritization,” and “reasonable network management.”

This bill prohibits internet service providers from:

- 1) blocking lawful content, application, services, or nonharmful devices;
- 2) impairing, impeding, or degrading lawful internet content;
- 3) engaging in paid prioritization;
- 4) unreasonably interfering with or unreasonably disadvantaging a customer’s ability to access the internet, or an edge provider’s ability to provide lawful internet content;
- 5) engaging in deceptive or misleading marketing practices; or
- 6) engaging in zero-rating in exchange for compensation from a third party.
