Local Use and Support for Ranked Choice Voting in Minnesota

The RCV local option has long been part of the <u>League of Minnesota Cities' legislative priorities</u> (SD-76). Five cities currently use ranked choice voting for their municipal elections, and several localities have passed resolutions in support of a local option for RCV or have added this policy as a priority in their legislative agenda.
