### **Bill Description**

This bill establishes requirements for all law enforcement officers that are assigned to the role of School Resource Officer (SRO) to be trained as an SRO beginning June 1, 2025.

Section 9 Sub. 4 Requires by January 1, 2025, the Board of Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST), in consultation with the Minnesota School Safety Center, develop learning standards to SRO training courses.

Section 10 Sub. 5 Requires by June 1, 2025, a model SRO policy be developed after consultation with the Minnesota School Safety Center. Including the need for ongoing training for SROs.

Section 9 Sub 3 Instruction required beginning June 1, 2025, by the Minnesota School Safety Center or the National SRO Basic Course with a mandated completion date of June 1, 2027.

#### **Assumptions**

It is assumed that with the bill requirements for the need for SRO training- both initial and ongoing- will more than double, resulting in the need for Mn Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM) to expand the Minnesota School Safety Center staff to handle the increased workload and demand for training by local law enforcement agencies and school districts. The Minnesota School Safety Center currently offers two SRO trainings per year to a total of approximately 60 SROs. The training is currently offered through the work of 1 FTE (Planner Principal State) and .5 FTE (Planner Program Supervisor). With additional staff, the Minnesota School Safety Center will be able to offer four trainings per year to approximately 120 SROs through the addition of 3 FTEs (Planner Principal State).

The three FTEs would be hired in FY24 to work on the development of the learning standards for the SRO training course by January 1, 2025, support the development of the model SRO policy by June 1, 2025, and to support the delivery of the SRO training to meet the increased demand as a result of the model policy and training standards. The training support will also include the yearly School Safety Center conference, SRO Summit, and ongoing school safety training and continuing education that the Minnesota School Safety Center will offer. The training offerings will be offered throughout the State of MN requiring the Minnesota School Safety staff to travel to multiple locations across Minnesota to deliver the training.

#### Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula

3 Fulltime Equivalents (FTE) at \$150,000 (salary and fringe) per year totaling \$450,000 per year.

FY24: 3 FTE at \$50,000 each (pro-rated March1, 2024-June 30, 2024) for a total of \$150,000

FY 25: \$490,000 total

· 3 FTEs at \$150,000 per year

 $\cdot$  \$25,000 per year to support expanded delivery of SRO training offerings. Costs could include facility, IT, and program materials for course delivery.

• \$15,000 per year to support staff travel and training for remote delivery of SRO training.

### Long-Term Fiscal Considerations

#### Local Fiscal Impact

All training provided by the Minnesota School Safety Center is free. Local law enforcement agencies could have cost associated with travel to the training and the associated back fill costs to fill the officer's role in their department while attending the training.

### **Bill Description**

This bill states that a school resource office is not considered an employee or agent of a district. It requires a school board or charter school board that contracts for school resource officer services to ensure the contract meets the requirements of section 626.8482. The list of agents of the district is further clarified, and it notes that the limits on use of force only apply to the specified persons.

A new statute is created that provides for definitions for school and school resource officer; lists the duties for a school resource officer; outlines the required training timeline for a school resource officer; lists the minimum learning objectives that the Board of Peace Officer Standards and Training, in consultation with the Department of Public Safety's School Safety Center, must include in training courses, and lists the model policy minimum requirements that the Board of Peace Officer Standards and Training must develop; requires each law enforcement agency with a school resource officer program to develop, adopt, and implement a school resource officer written policy with a list of minimum requirements; and allows the board to impose license sanctions and seek injunctive relief for failure to comply with the requirements of this section.

\$150,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$490,000 in fiscal year 2025 and later is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of public safety to increase staffing in the department's school safety center and perform the duties required by the act.

#### Assumptions

There will be no state costs for MDE.

MDE is not required to prepare learning objectives for training courses to instruct peace officers in serving as a school resource officer or develop a model school resource office policy under M.S. 626.8482.

## Local Fiscal Impact

There might be an unknown local cost for districts and charters if a school safety officer's employer charges them to provide the required training courses under M.S. 626.8482, Section 9. This could be seen in higher contract charges between the school district or charter school and police department.

### **Bill Description**

This bill requires the Board of Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) to:

- · Establish minimum training requirements (learning objectives) for school resource officers
- · Develop a school resource officer model policy

## **Assumptions**

POST will consult with the Department of Public Safety's School Safety Center, the Minnesota School Boards Association, the Minnesota Association of Secondary School Principals, Education Minnesota, the Minnesota Sheriffs' Association, the Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association, the Minnesota Police and Peace Officers Association, Juvenile Officers Association, Solutions Not Suspensions, and the Minnesota Youth Council, and at least one community organization supporting the rights of special education students, to develop a model school resource officer policy. POST will use the time of one staff member to facilitate meetings and create the final document.

POST will consult with the Department of Public Safety's School Safety Center to prepare and promulgate learning objectives for training courses to instruct peace officers serving as a school resource officer. POST will use the time of one staff member to facilitate meetings and create of the final learning objectives and distribute them accordingly.

#### Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula

Policy work: One professional position: 50 hours @ \$57 (including fringe) = \$2,850

Learning objective development: One professional position: 50 hours @ \$57 (including fringe) = \$2,850

#### Long-Term Fiscal Considerations

Upon completion of the project, there will be minimal costs associated with this mandate. These can be absorbed by the

agency.

### Local Fiscal Impact

For local agencies with school resource officer programs, there may be additional costs associated with the training requirement, depending on whether or not the agency has already sent the assigned officer to the training. Future appointments of school resource officer will certainly require an investment of time and training costs by the agency.
