Dear Chair Marty and Members of the Senate Finance Committee:

The Minnesota Ethnic Studies Coalition – which brings together nearly two dozen community, youth and education organizations – writes in strong support of the Omnibus Legacy Bill (SF 5116) and the funding it provides for Underrepresented Groups Cultural and Ethnic Studies Materials.

Unlike other content areas such as Math, Literacy and Science, Cultural and Ethnic Studies curriculum and materials cannot be purchased from a curriculum and textbook service provider. SF5116 would allocate \$1M in fiscal year 2025 from the arts and cultural heritage fund to support the development of high-quality academic cultural and ethnic studies materials for communities that do not have adequate materials or who are underrepresented. This appropriation will directly support the development of materials that are co-constructed from the shared knowledge of educators, community experts, students and families.

As Minnesota schools become increasingly diverse, the need for culturally responsive and reflective curriculum is only more relevant. Studies show that when students see their own experiences and backgrounds within their curriculum, they become more engaged in learning, have a greater sense of belonging, and achieve better educational outcomes. SF5116 will invest in curricular resources to better meet the educational needs of all Minnesota students.

Thank you to Senator Hawj for recognizing this critical need and authoring the legislation to provide these valuable funds.
