BILL SUMMARY



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S.F. No. 3915 – Department of Administration governance technical changes.

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Section 1. [Federal Assistive Technology Act; 16B.055, subd. 1] adds the Board of Aging to the list of agencies from which representatives are to be appointed by the commissioner of administration to the Minnesota Assistive Technology Advisory Council. Updates cites to the new federal law on assistive technology.

Section 2 [Reimbursements; 16B.48, subd. 4] changes the date from July 1 to September 15 each year for the commissioner of administration to report to the legislature on the rates to be charged for the general services revolving funds.

Section 3 [Report; 16C.137, subd. 2] changes a requirement to report to the legislature to a requirement to post on a public dashboard the findings of the commissioners of various state agencies on goals, directives and recommendations and revised goals, revised directives, and legislative initiatives, relating to minimizing energy use and using renewable fuels for certain state vehicles.

Section 4 [Cemeteries; records and condition assessments; 307.08, subd. 3a] adds a requirement that the selection of the professional archaeologist, qualified anthropologist, or other appropriate expert to be retained to gather information to assess or identify cemeteries must be approved by the Indian Affairs Council if probable American Indian cemeteries are to be disturbed or probable American Indian remains analyzed.

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
