

1.1 Senator moves to amend S.F. No. 2026 as follows:

1.2 Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

1.3 "Section 1. Laws 2023, chapter 68, article 4, section 126, is amended to read:

1.4 Sec. 126. **LEGISLATIVE REPORT; SPEED SAFETY CAMERAS.**

1.5 (a) By November 1, 2024, the commissioner of public safety must submit a report to
1.6 the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction
1.7 over transportation policy and finance that ~~identifies a process and associated policies for~~
1.8 ~~issuance of a mailed citation to the owner or lessee of a motor vehicle that a speed safety~~
1.9 ~~camera system detects is operated in violation of a speed limit~~ analyzes legislation heard
1.10 during the 2024 legislative session that seeks to establish statewide implementation of traffic
1.11 camera enforcement, where the owner or lessee of a motor vehicle is issued a citation from
1.12 a traffic camera system when the vehicle is operated in violation of a speed limit or
1.13 traffic-control signal.

1.14 (b) The commissioner must convene a task force to assist in the development of the
1.15 report. The task force must include the Advisory Council on Traffic Safety under Minnesota
1.16 Statutes, section 4.076, a representative from the Minnesota County Attorneys Association,
1.17 and a person with expertise in data privacy and may include other members as the
1.18 commissioner determines are necessary to develop the report.

1.19 (c) At a minimum, the report must include consideration and analysis of:

1.20 (1) methods to identify the owner, operator, and any lessee of the motor vehicle;

1.21 (2) compliance with federal enforcement requirements related to holders of a commercial
1.22 driver's license;

1.23 (3) authority of individuals who are not peace officers to issue citations;

1.24 (4) data practices, including but not limited to concerns related to data privacy;

1.25 (5) due process, an appeals process, the judicial system, and other legal issues;

1.26 (6) technology options, constraints, and factors; and

1.27 (7) recommendations regarding implementation, including but not limited to any
1.28 legislative proposal and information on implementation costs.

1.29 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment."
