The language incorporating the A-6 will be offered as an amendment to the A-1 on Friday, April 19. Below are the differences between the A-6 and SF 2026 as it passed out of committee:

- Technical changes in the definition of a red light and speed safety camera systems (169.011, subd. 62b, 169.011, subd. 77a)
- Prohibition on towing of a vehicle for a violation of a traffic camera system.
- Instituting a pilot project with limited duration systems effective between June 1, 2025, and June 1, 2029. The first engrossment is not a pilot project and instead effective June 1, 2025.
- Specifies the locations where the pilot project may be instituted:
 - o Minneapolis,
 - Mendota Heights,
 - $\circ\quad$ a city of the first class outside the Metro area,
 - o one county selected by MnDOT,
 - o A trunk highway workzone speed enforcement pilot project jointly conducted by MnDOT and DPS.
- Institutes a solicitation of comment and review requirement for establishing camera standards
- Institutes new placement requirements one camera system may be placed per 10,000 residents. Requires geographic and socioeconomic diversity in deployment of camera systems.
- Institutes an affirmative defense and specifies additional appeal criteria on the back of a citation
- Specifies additional data practices requirements for traffic camera systems.
- Removes the work zone safety camera pilot program establishment in session law.

ESF 3085 was heard in Transportation on March 18, 2024. The A-2 amendment was adopted in committee with a corresponding oral amendment to shift the effective dates to October 1, 2024, rather than final enactment. Before its inclusion, further changes to the SF 3085 language (as introduced) beyond the A-2's language were made:

- Section 1 of SF 3085 (as introduced) is not included in the supplemental finance omnibus.
- Section 3 of SF 3085 (as introduced) is not included in the supplemental finance omnibus.
- Section 4 of SF 3085 (as introduced) has a minor technical fix.
- Section 6 inserted in the A-2 is changed to loop in the requirement that dealers must apply for title if they seek replacement plates for a vehicle with valid Minnesota registration.
- F Section 10 (Minn. Stat. 360.075, subd. 1) from the <u>first engrossment of S.F. 3975</u> is not included in the delete-everything amendment.

^G When S.F. 3993 was heard in Transportation, Senator Morrison offered the SCS3993A-5 amendment. Certain provisions of that amendment and SF 3993 were jacketed as SF 5211. Certain elements of SF 5211 were included in the supplemental transportation bill, either as changes to provisions in SF 3993 or by directly including provisions from SF 5211 (which are items *H*, *I*, and *J* below). Changes to SF 3993 to incorporate language from SF 5211 includes:

- Technical fix to the definition of electric-assisted bicycle to provide that a vehicle is not an e-bike if it can be modified or configured to no longer meet the definition or classification of an e-bike. (Sec. 33)
- Technical fix to e-bike riding rules (Sec. 49 at 52.9)
- Adds electric-assisted bicyclists to definition of a vulnerable road user and requires their inclusion as a vulnerable road user in the Minnesota Driver's Manual (Sec. 40 at 41.11, Sec. 64 at 63.22)
- Technical fix to multiple-mode e-bike labeling requirements (Sec. 50 at 52.15)
- Substantive changes to the sale and disclosure requirements of e-bikes. Removes powered cycle definition. Provides that a seller of a motorcycle or motorized bicycle with an electric motor for propulsion may not offer the vehicle for sale as an electric-assisted bicycle. (Sec. 96)
