

1.1 Senator moves to amend S.F. No. 4474 as follows:

1.2 Page 4, after line 19, insert:

1.3 "Sec. 5. Minnesota Statutes 2023 Supplement, section 256B.0625, subdivision 9, is
1.4 amended to read:

1.5 Subd. 9. **Dental services.** (a) Medical assistance covers medically necessary dental
1.6 services.

1.7 (b) The following guidelines apply to dental services:

1.8 (1) posterior fillings are paid at the amalgam rate;

1.9 (2) application of sealants are covered once every five years per permanent molar; and

1.10 (3) application of fluoride varnish is covered once every six months.

1.11 (c) In addition to the services specified in paragraph ~~(b)~~ (a), medical assistance covers
1.12 the following services:

1.13 (1) house calls or extended care facility calls for on-site delivery of covered services;

1.14 (2) behavioral management when additional staff time is required to accommodate
1.15 behavioral challenges and sedation is not used;

1.16 (3) oral or IV sedation, if the covered dental service cannot be performed safely without
1.17 it or would otherwise require the service to be performed under general anesthesia in a
1.18 hospital or surgical center; and

1.19 (4) prophylaxis, in accordance with an appropriate individualized treatment plan, but
1.20 no more than four times per year.

1.21 (d) The commissioner shall not require prior authorization for the services included in
1.22 paragraph (c), clauses (1) to (3), and shall prohibit managed care and county-based purchasing
1.23 plans from requiring prior authorization for the services included in paragraph (c), clauses
1.24 (1) to (3), when provided under sections 256B.69, 256B.692, and 256L.12.

1.25 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.

1.26 Sec. 6. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 256B.0625, subdivision 12, is amended to read:

1.27 Subd. 12. **Eye-glasses, ~~dentures,~~ and prosthetic and orthotic devices.** (a) Medical
1.28 assistance covers eye-glasses, ~~dentures,~~ and prosthetic and orthotic devices if prescribed by
1.29 a licensed practitioner.

2.1 (b) For purposes of prescribing prosthetic and orthotic devices, "licensed practitioner"
2.2 includes a physician, an advanced practice registered nurse, a physician assistant, or a
2.3 podiatrist.

2.4 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
