1.13	services verifying whether each of its institutions meets the requirements to be a
1.14	campus-based employment and training program that qualifies for the student exemption
1.15	for supplemental nutrition assistance program (SNAP) eligibility, as described in the Code
1.16	of Federal Regulations, title 7, section 273.5(b)(11)(iv).
1.17	(b) An institution of higher education must be designated as a campus-based employment

1.21	Subd. 2. Student eligibility. A student is eligible to participate in a campus-based

1.29	Subd. 3. Guidance. Within three months of the enactment of this section and annually
1.30	thereafter, the commissioner of human services, in consultation with the commissioner of
1.31	higher education, must issue guidance to counties, Tribal Nations, Tribal colleges, and
1.32	Minnesota public postsecondary institutions that does the following:

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2.1	(1) clarifies the state and federal eligibility requirements for campus-based employment

2.11	Subd. 4. Application. Within three months of the enactment of this section, the
2.12	commissioner of human services, in consultation with the commissioner of higher education,
2.13	must design an application for institutions of higher education to apply for a campus-based
2.14	employment and training program designation.
2.15	Subd. 5. Notice. At the beginning of each academic semester, an institution of higher
2.16	education with a designated campus-based employment and training program must send a
2.17	letter to students eligible under this section to inform them that they may qualify for SNAP
2.18	benefits and direct them to resources to apply. The letter under this subdivision shall serve
2.19	as proof of a student's enrollment in a campus-based employment and training program.
2.20	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective upon federal approval. The commissioner
2.21	of human services must notify the revisor of statutes when federal approval is obtained."
