Senator Mohamed and Representative Feist,

I write to express Minnesota Assistance Council for Veterans' (MACV) support for SF 4018/HF 3971 (Bridge to Shelter Act) legislation that would provide much needed funding for Minnesota's homelessness response system. MACV is a statewide nonprofit with the mission of Ending Veteran Homelessness in Minnesota. We believe that every Veteran, and every Minnesotan, should have a place to call home. The \$60 million authorized in the bill will help further build out the system of supports that providers like us need.

The Veterans we serve face numerous challenges, most of them structural. Our work involves supporting them as they navigate the social services systems, ensuring that they can meet their basic needs, and secure stable and dignified housing. Services like crisis response, diversion, outreach, and housing-focused case management are vital to the program success, all eligible under the Bridge to Shelter Act.

Minnesota has been trending in the right direction, as a recent study from the Wilder Foundation reported that homelessness has declined slightly over the past few years. And the investment in supports for Veterans show the positive difference that can be made. It is noteworthy that the COVID-19 pandemic and unprecedented funding in rental and housing assistance also has played a significant role. With that assistance gone, we would be unable to sustain our efforts and services we provide in ending homelessness in our communities. SF 4018/HF 3971 would mitigate that gap of funding and resources and would help continue our efforts in taking care of some of our most vulnerable population in our state.

Thank you for advancing this legislation and your work to ensure that, until we end homelessness, that it is rare, brief, and non-reoccurring.
