Minnesota's Prenatal to Three Coalition (PN-3) writes to you in support of SF 4807, to fund the continuation of critically important lactation consultation and education in Minnesota's African American community. Chosen Vessels Midwifery Services is a trusted community partner that works to address health disparities by destignatizing breastfeeding and providing direct support to pregnant and parenting people.

Institutional racism has resulted in the reciprocation of distrust between communities and the healthcare system. The historical trauma of slavery and the use of wet nurses in the past has resulted in the continued cultural stigmatization of breastfeeding in the African American community. This stigma has created a barrier to accessing quality lactation consultation and continues to negatively impact African American birth outcomes and breastfeeding rates.

Chosen Vessels Midwifery Services offers a trusted space and support for pregnant and lactating African American people to reach their breastfeeding goals. Human breast milk boosts the child's immune system and lowers their risk for numerous chronic diseases while supporting the physical and mental health of the breastfeeding person during postpartum period.
