1.3 polling place on the institution's campus; amending Minnesota Statutes 2023

1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2023 Supplement, section 203B.081, subdivision 4, is

1.7 amended to read:

1.8 Subd. 4. **Temporary locations.** (a) A county auditor or municipal clerk authorized under

1.9 section 203B.05 to administer voting before election day may designate additional polling

1.10 places with days and hours that differ from those required by section 203B.085. A designation

1.11 authorized by this subdivision must be made at least 47 days before the election. The county

1.12 auditor or municipal clerk must provide notice to the secretary of state at the time that the

1.13 designations are made.

1.14 (b) At the request of a federally recognized Indian Tribe with a reservation in the county,

1.15 the county auditor must establish an additional polling place for at least one day on the

1.16 Indian reservation on a site agreed upon by the Tribe and the county auditor that is accessible

1.17 to the county auditor by a public road.

- 2.1 institutions with an undergraduate enrollment of at least 1500, including full-time and
2.2 part-time students. This paragraph does not apply to a postsecondary institution where
2.3 students attend courses primarily online or there is no physical campus where students attend
2.4 courses in-person.
