Re: Resources to support critical infrastructure necessary for housing development

Chair Port and members of the Senate Housing and Homelessness Prevention Committee:

The League of Minnesota Cities appreciate the opportunity to voice our support for SF 3768 (Hauschild), which would provide additional capital investment resources to support the Greater Minnesota Housing Infrastructure program. The additional \$20 million in capital investment resources and the increase in the maximum grant amount will allow this new program to assist a broader swath of greater Minnesota cities with preparing residential sites for development and help defray the costs for the public infrastructure necessary to support new housing development across the state.

While local communities across Minnesota are focusing on local efforts to attract development and encourage growth, the infrastructure necessary to support and accommodate new housing developments and the new residents that come with them can be a challenging and costly hurdle for both cities and the development community. Funding for infrastructure grants available to cities to assist with the cost of providing critical infrastructure will help ensure that residential sites are shovel ready for development and will pave the way for new housing construction that supports local economic growth and provide more housing opportunities for residents.

We thank Senator Hauschild for his support in providing additional resources for housing infrastructure grants to support local government efforts in attracting development. The \$20 million in additional capital investment resources and the increase in maximum grant amount called for in SF 3768 will help support new housing developments across the state.
