On behalf of the undersigned members of the MN Leadership Council on Aging, I write today in support of SF4329 (Rasmusson)/HF4308 (Kiel), which removes the requirement that older adults signing a lease at a Minnesota assisted living must first call the Senior LinkAge Line to get counseling and an approval code.

As trusted organizations in our state's aging sector, we endorse policy solutions designed to advance our shared mission of creating communities and systems that support aging with dignity and a spirit of well-being in Minnesota. We have long held the belief that all people have the right to exercise choices and we advocate for change when these rights are impinged upon. We appreciate your responsibility to create policy solutions that support the people of our state on their respective journeys.

We're all aging. Minnesota's older adults and their families have questions that need trusted answers. As we age, everyone in our state will be better served if the busy counselors at the Senior LinkAge Line are freed up to focus on the increasing volume of Minnesotans who want assistance. Reallocating resources to reach older adults further upstream during care transitions would be a wiser use of existing funds.
