1 to 3, 6 to 10, 13, 16 to 18 and 34	<b>SF 5317</b> (Maye Quade)	Eliminates parental fees for families when a child is living in a children’s residential facility (CRFs), a psychiatric residential treatment facility (PRTF), a residential treatment center (RTCs), or an Intermediate Care Facilities for persons with Developmental Disabilities (ICF/DD) and makes various conforming and technical changes.
4 and 5	<b>SF 3809-1</b> (Boldon)	Modifies home and community-based services standards modification for out-of-home respite services for children and requires background studies
11 and 12	<b>SF 5335</b> , as amended (Hoffman)	AD-48: modifying experience requirements for certified MnCHOICES assessors who are RNs and extending the validity of MnCHOICES assessments from 60 days to 365 days.
14 and 32	Modified <b>SF 2968 -A4</b> (Hoffman)	Increases the transitional supports allowance from \$3,000 to \$4,000
15	<b>SF 3736-A1</b> (Rasmusson)	Modifies the rate encumbrance under DWRS to permit technology costs related to remote support to be included within the required encumbrances.
19	Modified <b>SF 5335</b> , as amended (Hoffman)	AD-48 modified: clarifies the requirements of requested recommendations and extends a due date for a report related to the provision of home care services and CFSS while a patient is in an acute care hospital.
20 and 21	Modified <b>SF 4174</b> (Fateh)	Modifies the eligible applicants and allowable uses under the provider capacity grant for rural and underserved communities grant by allowing grant funds to be used to assist providers determine the most appropriate license and program to best serve their targeted population.

22	Modified <b>SF 3841-A1</b> (Maye-Quade)	Establishes the advisory task force on family residential services.
23	Modified <b>SF 4268-A1</b> (Kupiec)	Permits lead agencies to establish assistive technology partnerships to facilitate timely authorizations of allowable technology and assess the benefits of the use of technology among HCBS waiver recipients.
24	<b>SF 4043-A1</b> (Hoffman)	Directs the commissioner of human services to draft legislative language proposing to permit CFSS support worker to work up to eight hours of overtime per week, provide overnight staffing, and work 80 consecutive hours.
25	<b>SF 5335</b> , as amended (Hoffman)	AD-48: permitting provision of unit-based waiver services under certain conditions in an acute care hospital
26	<b>SF 3894</b> (Boldon)	Requiring the commissioner to contract for a continuous improvement study regarding access to disability services.
27	<b>SF 5264</b> (Weber)	Establishing emergency relief grants for rural EIDBI providers
28	<b>SF 5244-2A</b> (Dibble)	Establishing the Legislative Task Force on Guardianship
29	<b>SF 3840-A1</b> (Abeler)	Establishing the own home services provider capacity-building grant
30	<b>SF 4094</b> (Maye Quade)	Establishing the pediatric hospital-to-home transition pilot project.
31	Modified <b>SF 3634</b> (Abeler)	Permitting state-only funding of PCA services provided by parents and spouses beginning October 1, 2024.
33	<b>SF 5335</b> , as amended (Hoffman)	AD-48: Develop a Tribal vulnerable adult/developmental disability targeted case management service as a covered medical assistance benefit.
34	Combined Repealer	Repealers from <b>SF 5317</b> (Maye Quade) related to eliminating parental fees and <b>SF 2968 -A4</b> (Hoffman) related to removing from statute waiver plan language related to transitional support allowances (note: the repealer from SF 2968-A4 does NOT repeal the transitional support allowance).

1 and 4 to 6	<b>SF 3402</b> (Hoffman)	Requiring assisted living facilities to provide quarterly medication regime reviews for all residents receiving medication management services, offer medication regime review to all residents, and conduct annual reviews of medication practices.
2 and 3	<b>SF 4296</b> (Hoffman)	Requiring assisted living facilities to provide all staff with training related to de-escalation and mental illness.
7 and 8	<b>SF 5335</b> , as amended (Hoffman)	AD-48: permitting transition planning in the alternative care program
9	Modified SF 1788-3A (Oumou Verbeten) and SF 1769 (Rasmusson)	Increases the property rate component for four nursing homes based on recent capital improvements of the facilities.
10 and 12	<b>SF 5335</b> , as amended (Hoffman)	AD-48: establishing elderly waiver budget and rate exceptions for high-need participants and require the commissioner to propose EW reforms to address the needs of older adults with high support needs.
11	Modified version of <b>SF 5335</b> , as amended (Hoffman)	AD-58 modified: rather than sunset the customized living rate floor, reduces the rate floor to \$145 per resident per day.

1, 5, 7	<b>SF 4460-A4</b> (Mann)	Modifies the priority admissions standards for patients being admitted to DCT programs from jails and correctional institutions, requires exceptions to the priority given to patients in jails and correctional institutions for 10 patients in community hospitals;

		and establishes a priority admissions review board to develop further recommendations regarding admissions to DCT programs and monitor implementation of the new prioritization standards.
2	<b>New</b>	Prohibits the closure of or modification of the population served by the community addiction recovery enterprise program in Carlton.
3	<b>SF 3409-A1</b> , modified	Forgives the debt of Beltrami County and Todd County for certain cost of care payments.
4	<b>SF 5249</b> (Rasmusson)	Engagement services pilot program in Otter Tail County
6	<b>SF 5335</b> , as amended (Hoffman)	DC-41: establishes a civil commitment reform taskforce

2	<b>SF 4198</b> (Abeler)	Extends by one year the due date of an evaluation report related to the direct care services corps pilot project.
3	<b>SF 5335</b> , as amended (Hoffman)	OP-50: Aligns the effective date of the new rates for substance use disorder treatment services with medications for opioid use disorder to align with the 2023 spreadsheet.
